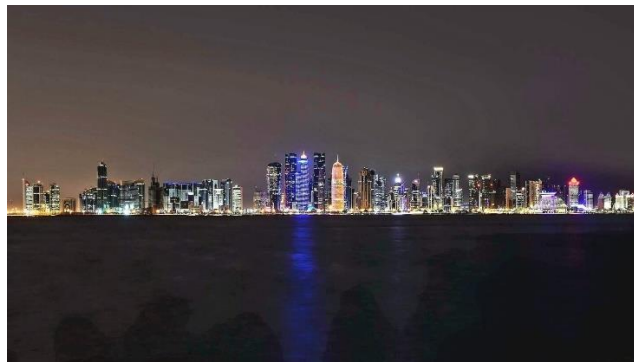




Qatar is a beautiful country
